Annual Report

The Annual Meeting was held as scheduled on the September Open Day, September 13 2008. The main points from the Chairman's Report were:

- The Committee met six times during the year
- The Depot opened every 2nd Sat. of the month as planned
- The Depot continues to be used as a meeting place for a number of rail based heritage groups
- The pigeon problem has been an on-going saga, but we could be winning
- A Sales centre established with the sales income often outweighing the door receipts
- DVD and TV donated by Yarra Trams
- NMETL 13 (V214) added to the Victorian Heritage Register
- Development of the Website commenced
- Many small tasks completed, including setting up the training room
- Many thanks to the small band of volunteers who assist with the depot operations.
- The Treasurer Reported Income \$1810, Expenses \$2168, Bank \$3582.

WEBSITE Launch

After many months of effort, the Friends of Hawthorn Tram Depot website has gone live at http://hawthorntramdepot.org.au

Surfers will find a wide range of articles about Melbourne's trams, especially their importance to our social history, as well as a detailed history of Hawthorn Depot. Articles specially written for the release of the website include one on the Sorrento tramway and another on MMTB social clubs. Other features of the website include news items, and a mail order facility to order tramway-related books and DVDs from our shop.

We plan on adding new content on a regular basis to ensure that our website retains interest for regular visitors. Members will have access to an exclusive area of the website which will initially contain all back issues of 'The Bellcord'. Further members—only material will be added over time, including a photographic archive as well as other material of interest to tramway enthusiasts. Logins and passwords will shortly be distributed to all financial members to enable them to access the exclusive area.

The design of the website takes inspiration from our logo, the Art Nouveau architecture of Hawthorn Depot and the original colours of the Hawthorn Tramways Trust. Special attention has been paid to the information architecture to facilitate simple navigation of the website, together with effective use of search engine optimisation techniques to maximise exposure to ensure that casual browsers will access our website.

To underline our reason for existence, the home page is being branded as the 'Melbourne Tram Museum @ Hawthorn Depot'. It is intended that this brand will be carried across other advertising material if and when we undertake any such campaigns. Initially, we will be making use of a small Google Adwords advertising campaign to add to the impact of the website launch.

This is a major step forward in the development of Hawthorn Depot as a centre for tramway heritage, and will lead to a higher local profile and hopefully a significant increase in visitor numbers and income.


Donations
